

## Health & Safety Statement.

As a Sole Proprietor it is not necessary to provide a health & safety policy. However having worked within the industry for many years and on construction sites I have a good knowledge and awareness of the health & safety requirements on site and am CSCS certificated.

If a contractor requires I would attend site inductions, carry out my own risk assessment and would prepare a method statement.

I would abide by the contractors specific requirements regarding PPE.

COSHH datasheets would be available on request for any relevant substances required to carry out decoration.

If there is suspected asbestos on site I would notify the contractor immediately. The removal of asbestos if necessary would be organised by the contractor and carried out by a qualified specialist.

If I feel that a working area has become unsafe due to structural issues or other trades working in close proximity I will notify the contractor and cease working until the working environment has been made safe.

If there is an area of the works that requires working at height, a risk assessment will be made and suitable access requirements will be discussed with the contractor. These areas must be highlighted prior to quotation. If not access equipment must be supplied by the contractor.

If a client or contractor requires me to carry out some additional works that is not within my skill set I have a number of skilled tradesmen at my disposal that are not directly employed by myself. These tradesmen (whose standard of workmanship meets with my approval), would act as subcontractors, are CSCS certified, and would be responsible for their own health & safety arrangements on site, along with providing relevant documentation to carry out their specific works.
